*Jesus told the woman in Samaria that “God is spirit”. This means that God does not have a body like ours, or any physical body. He is spiritual by nature. He can be worshiped everywhere, because he is not just in one place! As long as we have faith in Christ we can worship God in our spirits. That’s what Jesus meant by worshiping in “spirit and truth”.*

*This Psalm was used for royal weddings in Israel! It’s a song about a King and his beautiful bride. This is a picture of Jesus, as the King, who marries the Church, after dying for her sin, and saving her! We worship and praise our God and King (vs1-9). And we are reminded that whatever else we lose, coming to Jesus is a reward that brings eternal life and joy (vs10-17). Jesus loves us, and gives us many blessings!*



Read from a child-friendly version. Ask children to read as appropriate, respective to age. Briefly explain the meaning of the passage. If you need help, here is our summary:

*When the Jewish Christians were spread out from Jerusalem because of persecution, James wrote to them to strengthen them. He taught them that troubles and persecution are not outside of God's plan, they ARE God's plan to make us stronger in our faith! When we are in trials, we can pray to God for wisdom so that we can make the right decisions.*

## Extension

**ADDITIONAL READING & DISCIPLESHIP**

**CATECHISM REFERENCE** - Psalms 139:7-10

*Physical bodies can't be everywhere, but this Psalm tells us that God is everywhere. Because God has no body, he is unlimited by space and places. No matter where you go, you can trust that God is with you. And if we ever sin and try to run from God, we must remember that we can't escape Him. He is everywhere. How does it make you feel, to know that there is nowhere in the universe that God is not present?*

**CATECHISM REFERENCE** - 1 Timothy 1:17

*Paul tells Timothy that God is great, and powerful, and more glorious than us! God lives, forever, never dies, and never gets old. This is because He doesn't have a body! Without a body, God is invisible! So, even when we can't see God, we can trust that he is with us. God did send his Son to have a human body, though, so that he could die for our sins - and he still has that human body! But his God-nature is not physical; as God He is still spiritual and non-physical. This can be confusing, but it is a reminder that Paul is right: God is greater than us!*
