Catechism Reference

Hebrews 2:17

Read from a child-friendly version. Ask children to read as appropriate, respective to age. Briefly explain the meaning of the verse. If you need help, here is our summary:

Hebrews tells us that to save us, Jesus had to become one of us! If you want to buy a bike worth \$30, you have to pay for it with dollars, not with plastic or pinecones! In the same way, God's wrath for sin was against humans. Human life was the price. Human death was the punishment. Human suffering was the cost. So to pay our debt, and take God's wrath, Jesus had to become "like us in every way". Vs 14 says that since we have flesh and blood - Jesus had a body with flesh and blood too. He became one of us so he could represent us perfectly and "make propitiation" (which means atone for our sin).

In this psalm, David is crying to God for help. He feels lonely, even like God is not with him. Have you ever felt like this? In vs5 and 6, he reminds himself that even though there is plenty to cry about, there is always something to thank God for. God has loved us in many ways, and it helps lift up our hearts when we remember them. What ways has God blessed you and helped you? The best thing to thank him for is always salvation from sin in Jesus, which is a blessing that can never be taken away!

Sermon Reading

Colossians 2:13-14

Read from a child-friendly version. Ask children to read as appropriate, respective to age. Briefly explain the meaning of the passage. If you need help, here is our summary:

This Sunday we have Baptisms in the morning! During baptisms, we celebrate that someone has become a Christian! In Colossians 2:13-14, Paul gives us a picture of what Jesus did for us on the cross. He made us alive, by forgiving us. Spiritual death is a punishment for being unforgiven - but when God forgives someone he gives them new life! That new life and forgiveness was bought by Jesus on the cross, where he was punished for all our debts. Since we don't owe anything legally anymore, we are "justified", meaning, righteous in God's sight.

When God cursed Satan for tempting Eve, He promised that Satan would be defeated one day! The one who would come and defeat him, was going to be a man! Satan tried to destroy humans who were made in God's image, but instead he was going to be destroyed by a human! Jesus is God, and he is human, which fulfils this prophecy. He is the saviour and King of a new human race, who defeated our enemy, Satan, for us. Satan beat Adam, but he couldn't beat Jesus.

Sermon Reading

Jude 8-13

Read from a child-friendly version. Ask children to read as appropriate, respective to age. Briefly explain the meaning of the passage. If you need help, here is our summary:

This Sunday's sermon is about people who pretend to be Christians, but twist the truth and mislead people. Sometimes these people even become Pastors. Jude says Jesus will judge them on the last day, but that Christians should avoid them in this life. His word pictures in vs12 show how dangerous the fake Christians are. "Hidden reefs" damage boats - they hit the hull and sink them! "Shepherds feeding themselves" are dangerous for the sheep! The sheep will starve if the shepherd eats all the food (maybe he's even eating the sheep!). "Waterless clouds" make farmers think there will be rain, but then don't give you any water to survive. So when Pastors preach, and parents teach the Bible, we should listen the best we can so that we are protected from lies. Discuss what the most important truths of Scripture are.

CATECHISM REFERENCE - 1 Peter 3:18

Jesus took on our full human nature. He had a body, mind and soul, just like a human. That's what Peter meant when Jesus was in the "flesh". But he took that nature on, so that he could die for us. He was "put to death in the flesh", but "made alive in the spirit". This means that his human nature suffered on the cross and died, but he received the gift of life in resurrection. Since Jesus has "suffered once for sins", we never need to suffer. God loves to forgive us because of Jesus.
